Wetland Tolerant Plants



Adiantum pedatum

Maidenhair Fern



- A delicate spiral of leaves on black, wiry stems make this distinctive fern easy to identify.
- Wider than tall, a very slow spreader, this attractive fern is surprisingly drought tolerant once established.

Growing Requirements & Size:

- Average soil
- Shade
- 12-15" tall

Thelypteris noveboracensis

New York Fern



- Colonizes shady woodlands and forms a light green groundcover.
- Easily identified because both the top and the base of the fronds taper to a point.
- Host for Owlet moths.



Growing Requirements & Size:

- Average to moist soil
- Part shade
- 6-12" tall
- June – October spores

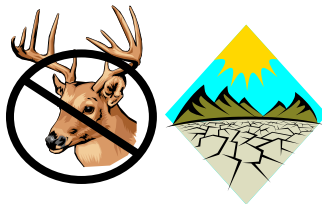
Woodsia ilvensis

Rusty Cliff Fern



- This petite fern produces tufts of fronds with silvery white undersides that turn rusty brown in fall.
- Excellent for rock gardens.

Growing Requirements & Size:

- Rocky, moderately acid soils
- Sun
- 2-10" tall
